

AAMA is a national association of medical assistants founded in 1956. The Certifying Board of the AAMA sponsors the examination for credentialing medical assistants as CMAs (AAMA). The Medical Assisting Education Review Board (MAERB) of the AAMA Endowment is a committee on accreditation of the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP), a body that accredits postsecondary medical assisting programs. Many state societies and local chapters exist throughout the United States as a means of education and networking for professional medical assistants.

NYSSMA sponsors educational seminars and an annual state convention to promote the profession of medical assisting and provide continuing education to its members. A publication, **NYSSMA Today**, is sent three times a year to all members.

The **Dorothy Ross Scholarship** was established to honor Dorothy Ross, the first President of NYSSMA. After many years of continued commitment to this organization, Dorothy passed away in 2003. It is an honor for members of NYSSMA to continue her legacy as a staunch advocate of the medical assistant profession by providing scholarship awards in her name to deserving medical assistant students.

The current scholarship award is \$500.00.

SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be an eligible candidate for this award, the applicant must:

- be a high school graduate or attained a GED certificate
- be accepted as a current student in a New York state medical assistant program accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs
- be committed to the career of medical assisting
- demonstrate a good academic record
- submit all required documents noted on the application by **January 31, 2011**.
